## Token

<b>Description</b>	<p>Create a temporary single sign-on URL to log in to your platform as the user provided during the authentication call.</p> <p>The response contains two fields:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• the first represents the link to access your platform: embed it in your website!</li><li>• the second represents the validity period of your token; when the token expires, you cannot access your platform using the single sign-on login URL provided.</li></ul>
